WORLD'S FIRST 3D-PRINTED SCHOOL IS BEING BUILT

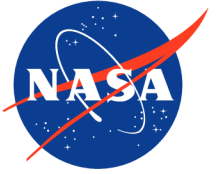
3D printing is a revolutionary technology that can transform the world in many ways. One of the most innovative and groundbreaking applications of this breakthrough technology is being used in Madagascar. Thanks to a collaboration between engineers and philanthropists, a 3D-printed school is being built there. The partnership involves the architecture firm Studio Mortazavi and the nonprofit group Thinking Huts. Construction has already begun.

If the pilot succeeds, lower construction costs could make launching new schools around the world far easier and faster. Completing a 3-D build of this scale would also create a replicable blueprint for many more classrooms to follow.

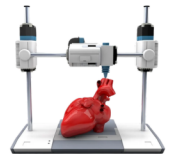

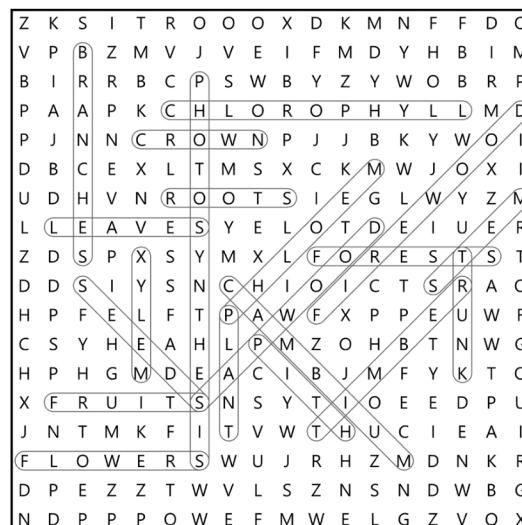

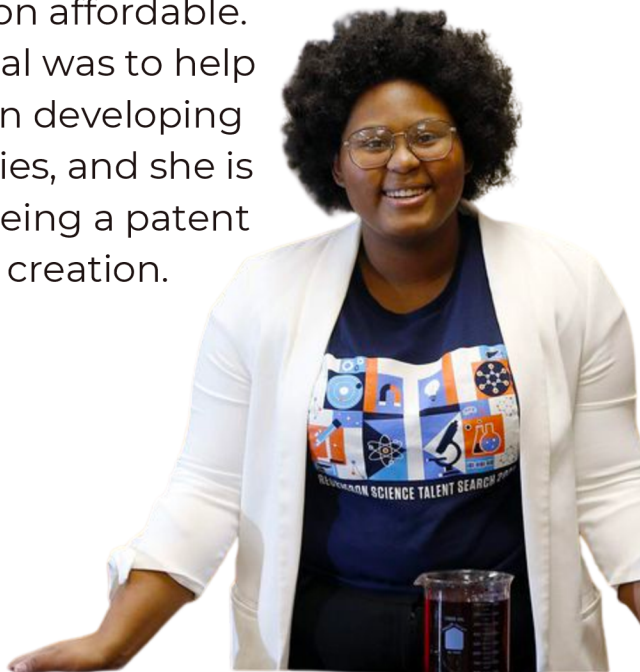

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT INVENTS SUTURES TO DETECT INFECTION

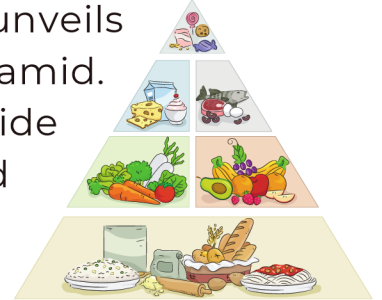
Dasia Taylor, a seventeen-year-old from Iowa City, Iowa, is making waves in the scientific community. She used beets to create her groundbreaking invention, an economic suture that changes color to signal when a wound is infected. Through her revolutionary creation, Dasia won awards at various regional science fairs and was one of 40 finalists at the Regeneron Science Talent Search, one of the most prestigious events.

Dasia's unique and affordable suture thread makes early detection of an infection affordable. Her goal was to help those in developing countries, and she is also eyeing a patent for her creation.

A VERTICAL FARMING COMPANY AIMS TO BRING FRESH PRODUCE, AND JOBS TO COMPTON, CA

Farming is usually done in fields spanning many acres, but the company, Plenty, is hoping to revolutionize this process. Plenty is an indoor vertical farming company that uses less space and fewer resources to grow flavorful, healthy, fresh, and clean produce year-round.

The company is constructing a vertical farm in Compton, California. This farm will condense 700 acres of farmland into a 95,000-square-foot warehouse in LA County. LED lights will shine down on rows of crops with robots to plant, feed and harvest the crops. Plenty's goal is to improve the lives of plants, people, and the planet; while tackling unemployment and food insecurity issues.
