A BREAKTHROUGH TO PROMOTE GREENER NUCLEAR POWER

Fusion is the process by which the sun generates energy. Harnessing that power on earth could potentially end many of the power-related troubles we currently face. Successfully doing so differs from the traditional nuclear approach by fusing atoms rather than splitting them apart.

The primary issue with nuclear fusion is that the temperatures exceed a hundred million degrees, creating a superheated plasma that needs to be cooled down for use. Harnessing fusion energy requires bringing these temperatures down. This might be possible thanks to the research out of a facility in Oxfordshire, England.

Scientists at the UK Atomic Energy Authority believe that they have found a breakthrough process called Magnetized Target Fusion. Fusion energy has great potential as a source of limitless, clean energy.

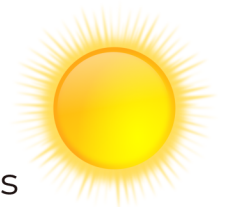

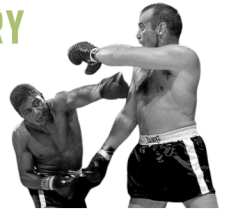
